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ASEAN – Russian Federation Plan of Action on Education (ARPAE) 2022-2026

Purpose: Consideration

Submitted by the Ministry of Education of the Russian Federation and the Ministry of Science and Higher Education of the Russian Federation

Background Information:

- 1. The ASEAN-Russia Working Group on Education (ARWGE) was officially agreed to be set up during the ASEAN-Russia Senior Officials' Round-Table Meeting held on 14 April 2016 in Moscow. The ASEAN Education Ministers Meeting subsequently endorsed the establishment of ARWGE and its Terms of Reference (ToR) in October 2018. The Inaugural Meeting of the Working Group took place on 30 October, 2018 in Nay Pyi Taw, Myanmar.
- 2. The Meeting agreed to pursue cooperation in education; vocational education and training; lifelong learning; e-learning and development of distant forms of learning; work with talented children and youth and disabled children and youth; quality assurance and transparency; and training for teachers and trainers.
- 3. The Meeting indicated the following activities in promoting educational cooperation:
 - i. To hold meetings of the ASEAN-Russia Working Group on Education (ARWGE) at least once every two years;
 - ii. To identify the priorities, specific areas, initiatives and forms of cooperation in accordance with the mutual interests of the ASEAN and the Russian Federation in the field of Education being developed by the ARWGE;
 - iii. To encourage knowledge transfer and exchange for the mutual benefit of the ASEAN Member States and the Russian Federation;
 - iv. To exchange educational statistics and implement major joint projects;
 - v. To ensure effective collaboration on providing the students' and academic mobility and assuring the highest equality of education.

Considerations in developing the ASEAN-Russia Plan of Action on Education (ARPAE 2022-2026)

4. The objective and proposed actions in the ARPAE 2022-2026 are formulated to be consistent with the goals and strategic thrusts of the ASEAN Agenda Post-2015; the Russian National Project Education for 2019-2024; ASEAN-Russia Trade and Investment Programme and the Comprehensive Plan of Action to promote cooperation between ASEAN and the Russian Federation (2016-2020). The context and direction of ASEAN-Russia cooperation on education is further guided by the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), specifically the Education 2030: Incheon Declaration and Framework for Action for the implementation of Sustainable Development Goal 4. This is in recognition of the key role of education, research, and innovation in attaining sustainable development that ensures social cohesion, economic development, and environmental protection.

Main Objective of the ARPAE 2022-2026:

5. The ARPAE 2022-2026 aims to serve as a guide in the planning, implementation, monitoring and assessment of activities that will strengthen cooperation in education between ASEAN and Russia.
